Commitment

Pursuant to Article 59 of the Act Relating to Children, 2018, the National Child Rights Council is constituted as a specialized body of the Government of Nepal for the protection of child rights under the chairmanship of the Hon'ble Minister of the Ministry of Women, Children and Senior Citizens. In particular, the Council has been advising on legal and policy provisions related to children, operating national child protection system, coordinating with governmental and non-governmental bodies at all levels on child rights and protection issues, and capacity building of stakeholders. The Council has been working for the protection and promotion of the fundamental rights of children guaranteed by the Constitution of Nepal, the Act Relating to Children, 2018 and the rights of children guaranteed by the Convention on the Rights of the Child.

The council has succeeded in reuniting 82 percent children to their families who were registered missing in the FY 2077/78. Similarly, rescue, protection and management of 355 street children, 58 children engaged in hazardous labor, 73 children in substandard Child Care Homes, 197 children and 716 children at risk has been carried out. Likewise, the council has facilitated the establishment and operation of child rights protection system at the local level by interacting with 542 local levels of all seven provinces. Out of this, child rights protection and promotion procedures have been formulated and implemented at 186 local levels, local child rights committees have been formed at 129 local levels, child welfare officers have been deployed at 51 local levels and child fund have been established at 135 local levels. It is believed that this will facilitate the implementation of children's rights at the local level.

The Council has expanded the Child Helpline 1098 service from 12 locations to 18 locations in the FY 2077/78 by providing operating permission to various non-government organizations. 10,368 children have directly benefited from the child helpline service operated in these 18 locations. During the Covid-19 pandemic, the council has set up

Covid helpdesks in 18 locations and mobilized 180 volunteers group in 60 districts and provide necessary services to 3,057 children. Similarly, the council is also working to protect and manage the children who lost their parents due to Covid-19.

The cooperation of development partners, media persons and civil society organizations with the council in above mentioned efforts are commendable. The Council also expresses gratitude to the Federal Ministries, the National Planning Commission, the Constitutional Commissions on Human Rights, the Provincial Governments, the District Coordinating Committees and the local level governments for their support in this endeavor. Likewise, the Council would like to express its heartfelt gratitude to the Covid Crisis Child Support Volunteer Group for its contribution to the protection and support of children from Covid-19.

The National Child Rights Council is committed to the protection and promotion of the rights, interests and entitlements of children. The Council is committed to increase the access of children at risk and those in need of special protection by expanding the services of Missing Child Response Center 104, which is operating as a national child protection system, and the Child Helpline 1098 service in the provinces. Similarly, it is committed to facilitate the establishment and operation of child rights protection system at the local level to ensure the rights of children, to deinstitutionalize alternative care of children as per the strategy of the Fifteenth Plan of the Government of Nepal, and to consult and coordinate for the necessary improvement in the policy and legal provisions related to children.

1. About National Child Rights Council



A) Introduction

The National Child Rights Council is formed by the federal government under the leadership of the Hon'bl Minister of the Ministry of Women, Children, and Senior Citizens. The council is mandated to carry out the work of protection and promotion of child rights as provided by Section 59 of the Act Related to Children, 2018. The council works to provide policy advice, capacity-building programs, and operates child protection systems (Child Helpline Services 1098 and Missing Child Response Services 104) in coordination with all three tiers of the governments. Similarly, the council works for the rescue, protection and management of the children who have been victim of violence and risk. The council has the mandate of coordinating and cooperating with the province and local level governments as well as inter-ministerial coordination at the federal level for the protection and promotion of child rights.

B) Mandate of NCRC

As mandated by Children's Rule 1995, (Second Amendment 2018), following are the mandates of the council:

- To approve the long term policy, plan and annual program, and budget of the National Child Rights Council,

- To provide advisory support the Government of Nepal, Province Government, and local level to arrange necessary policies, laws, plans, programs, and institutional mechanisms for respecting, protecting, promoting, and fulfilling the rights of children,
- To monitor, evaluate, review and suggest on the programs related to children operated by the Government of Nepal,
- To facilitate the preparation of periodic reports under the International Convention on the Rights of the Child on behalf of Nepal,
- To coordinate and make necessary facilitation with the concerned provincial and local child rights committees for the monitoring, evaluation, and review of child-related programs run by the provincial government and local levels,
- To increase the capacity of stakeholders in the protection and promotion of child rights,
- To publish the national status report on children annually on the basis of the annual report and details received from the provincial and local child rights committees,
- To develop, operate, manage and strengthen the national information system related to children,
- To arrange, mobilize, train, and build capacity of the office, staff and manpower, and financial resources of the National Child Rights Council,
- To conduct programs as per the need by mobilizing the assistance received from bilateral and multilateral development partners and international organizations for the protection and promotion of child rights with the approval of the Government of Nepal, Ministry of Finance,
- To launch a special national campaign for the protection of children and promotion of rights by setting priorities in line with the plans, annual policies, and programs approved by the Government of Nepal,
- To assist the province, local level, and local child rights committees in formulating local plans and programs related to the protection of children's rights and child welfare,
- To inspect Child Care Homes, juvenile correctional facilities, temporary protection services, and rehabilitation centers.

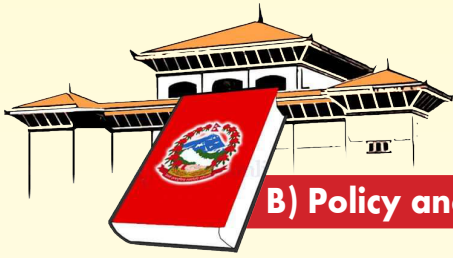

2. Policies, plans and programs of the Government of Nepal related to children

A) Strategies and Working policies in social sectors

Strategy	Working Policy
Strategy- 3: To make the lives of children and adolescents secure by ending all forms of violence against them.	Working Policy- 4: The Child Search & Rescue Helpline No. 104 and Child Helpline 1098 will be expanded up to the local level for the emergency rescue and protection of the children and these services will be advertised from the school to the general public. Working Policy- 7: To protect children from all kinds of harmful effects of internet abuse by making the online security more effective, programmes will be conducted in partnership between the state mechanism and the stakeholders.
Strategy- 4: To carry out the protection and promotion of the helpless, orphan, physically disabled, and abandoned children by the state.	Working Policy-1: The process of birth registration and citizenship will be simplified for the orphans and children requiring special protection. Working Policy-2: Temporary protection services will be managed for the protection and management of the orphan, helpless, abandoned, the children and adolescents with a disability as well as children and adolescents requiring special protection. Working Policy-3: Campaigns will be conducted from the provincial and local levels as well for the rescue and rehabilitation, prevention, and control of the street children. Working Policy-4: Appropriate standards will be formulated regarding the food, health, and security of the children living in child homes, juvenile reform homes, juvenile detention centres, and temporary shelter services, and regular monitoring of the compliance of the standards will be carried out.
Strategy- 6: To make necessary provisions by the state for ending child labour.	Working Policy-2: The child labourers will be rescued and rehabilitated by carrying out monitoring visits of the labourers everywhere.
Strategy- 7: To create a child-friendly environment by constructing child accessible infrastructures.	Working Policy-3: The topics of child rights, child-friendly governance, and child sensitivity enhancement will be included in the training curriculum of the subject teacher as well as of all government agencies and orientation and capacity development training will be provided.
Strategy- 8: To promote other alternative cares by discouraging and deinstitutionalizing the institutional residential protection of the existing children's homes and using them as the last resort only.	Working Policy-1: An alternative care system will be established for the children requiring special protection.



B) Policy and Programs of FY 2077/78

- **Point no. 86.** All forms of child labor exploitation will be eliminated.
- **Point no. 89.** Arrangements will be made for social protection by identifying the incapable, disabled and helpless, persons with disabilities and children who are unable to take care of themselves or work.
- **Point no. 239.** A national strategy on children will be prepared and implemented. With the cooperation and coordination of the province and local level, the rescue and protection of the orphaned children who are helpless or unaccompanied on the streets will be assured.
- **Point no. 242.** Helpless, health endangered, stranded, homeless people will be rescued, treated and rehabilitated.



C) Budget Statement of FY 2077/78

- **Point no. 71.** Program will be implemented to provide special security and protection from the nation to the economically deprived, disabled, helpless, incapable, single women, children, vulnerable and marginalized communities.
- **Point no. 74.** Arrangements have been made to keep the nation free of street dwellers by providing shelter, protection and care to all the incapable, unaccompanied, infected and homeless people.
- **Point no. 194.** A national strategy on children will be prepared and implemented. A nation free of street children will be made along with ending child labor forever.
- **Point no. 242.** Helpless, people in need of health support, stranded and homeless people will be rescued, treated and rehabilitated.

3. Key Achievements of FY 2077/78

A total 15,644 children have received protection assistance through the council in the FY 2077/78. Among 3,619 children through Missing Child Response Centers 104, 10,348 children through Child Helpline 1098 services and 1,657 children through the council have received the protection assistance.

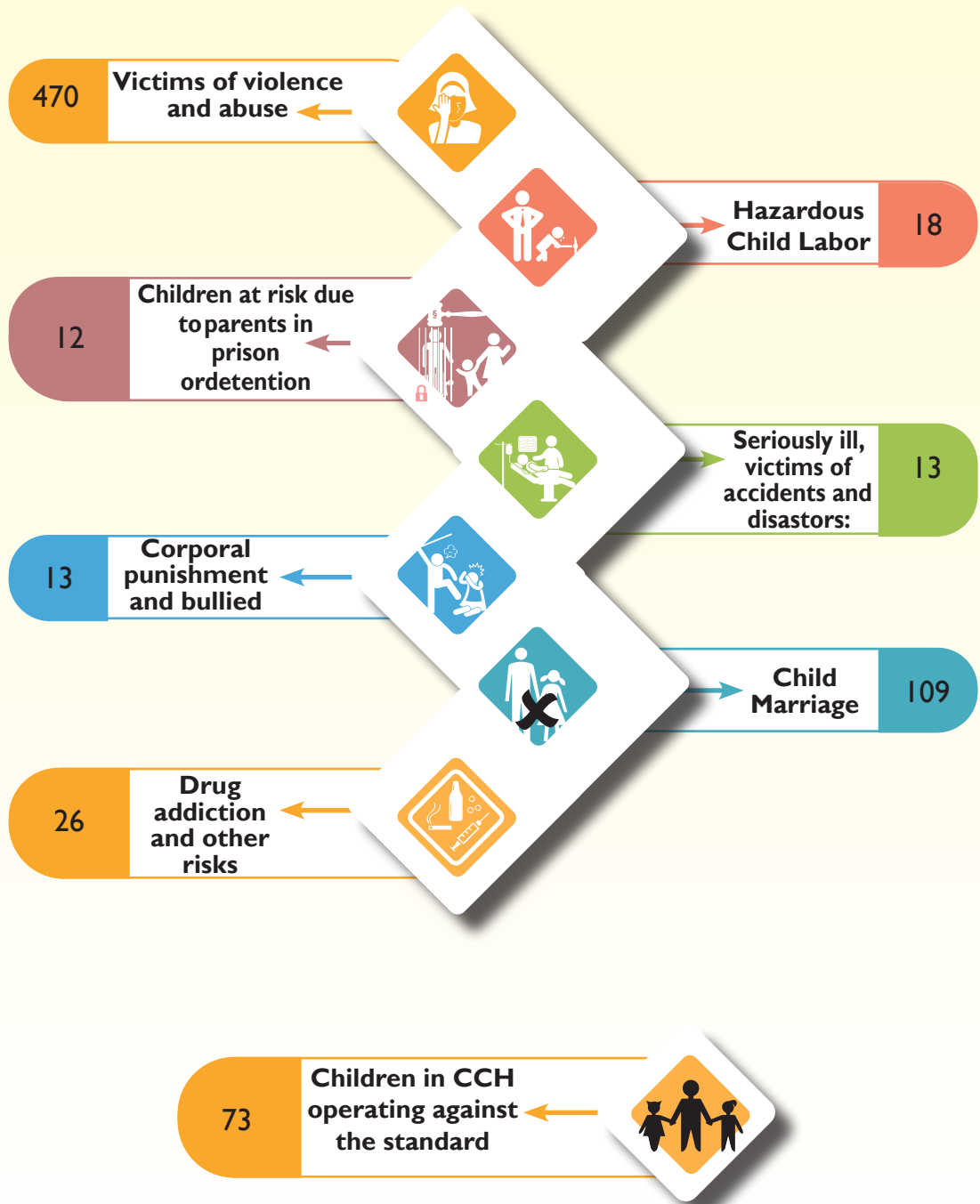

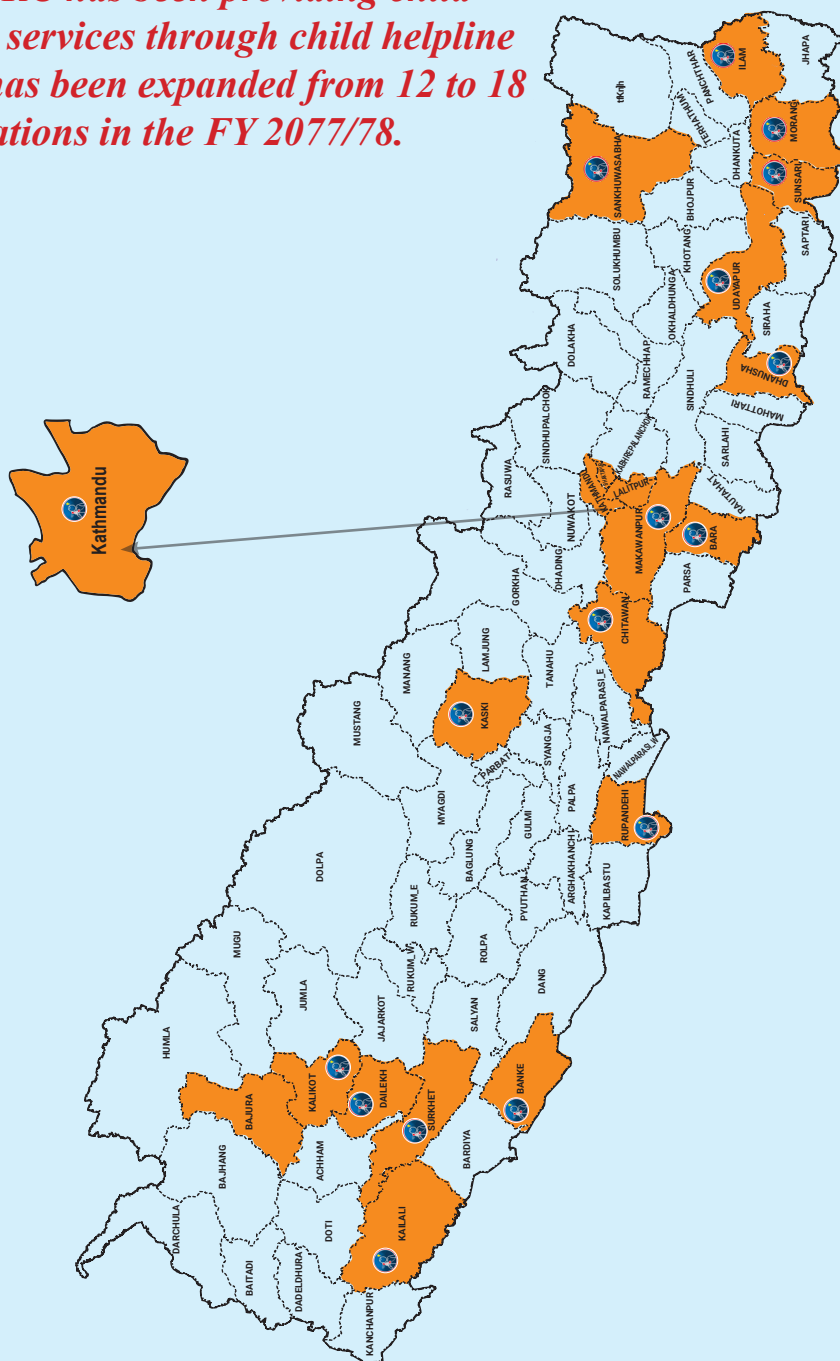

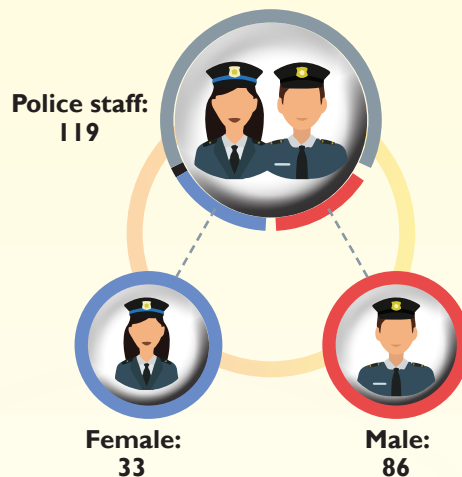


The NCRC has been providing child protection services through child helpline 1098 that has been expanded from 12 to 18 locations in the FY 2077/78.

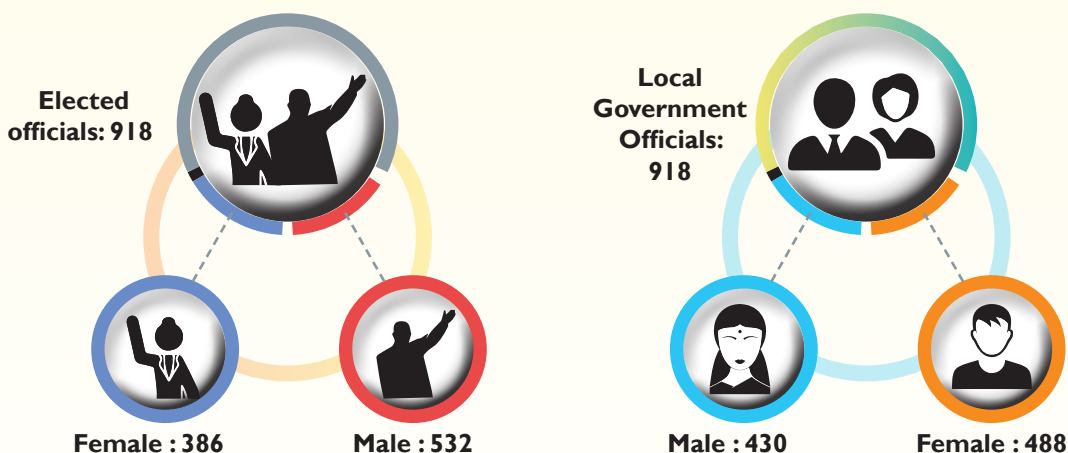


(E) Province and district level interaction for the implementation of the provisions of the Act Relating to Children, 2018

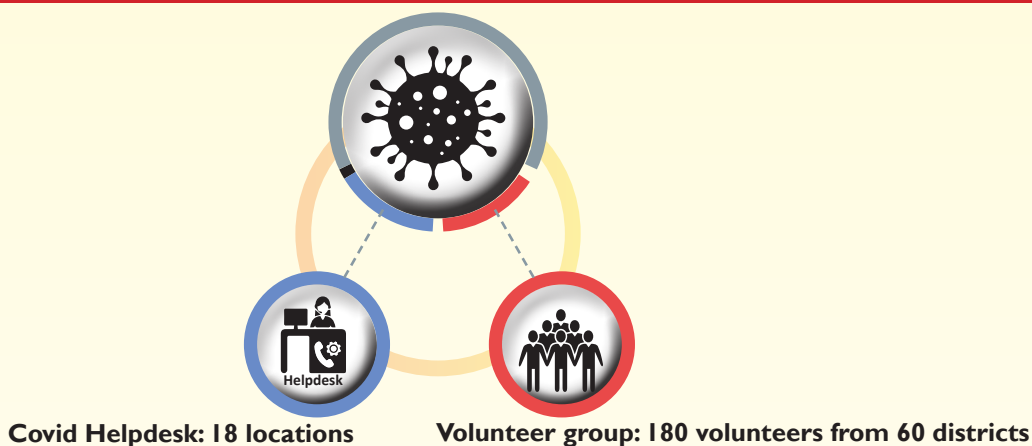

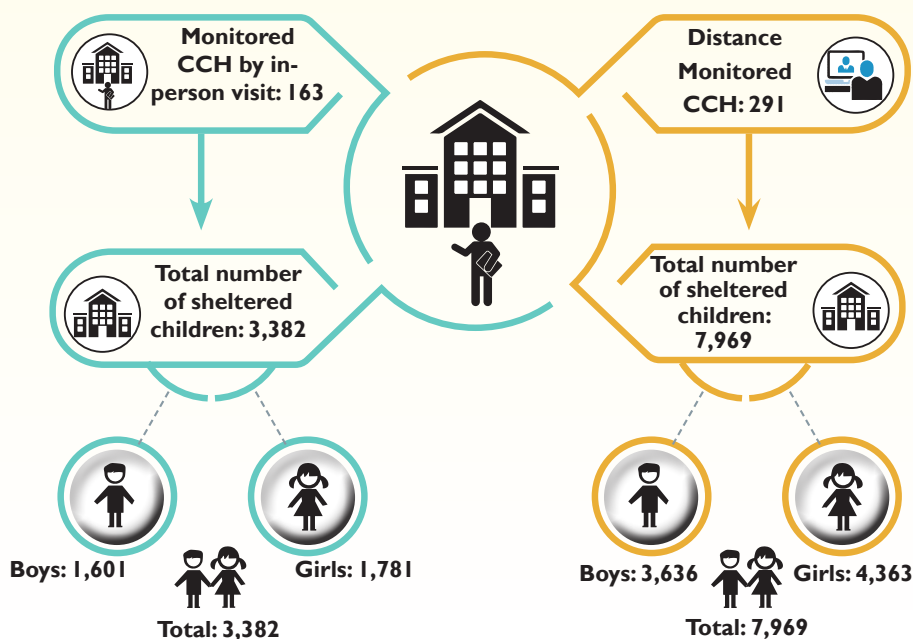
(F) Child protection work during Covid-19 Pandemic

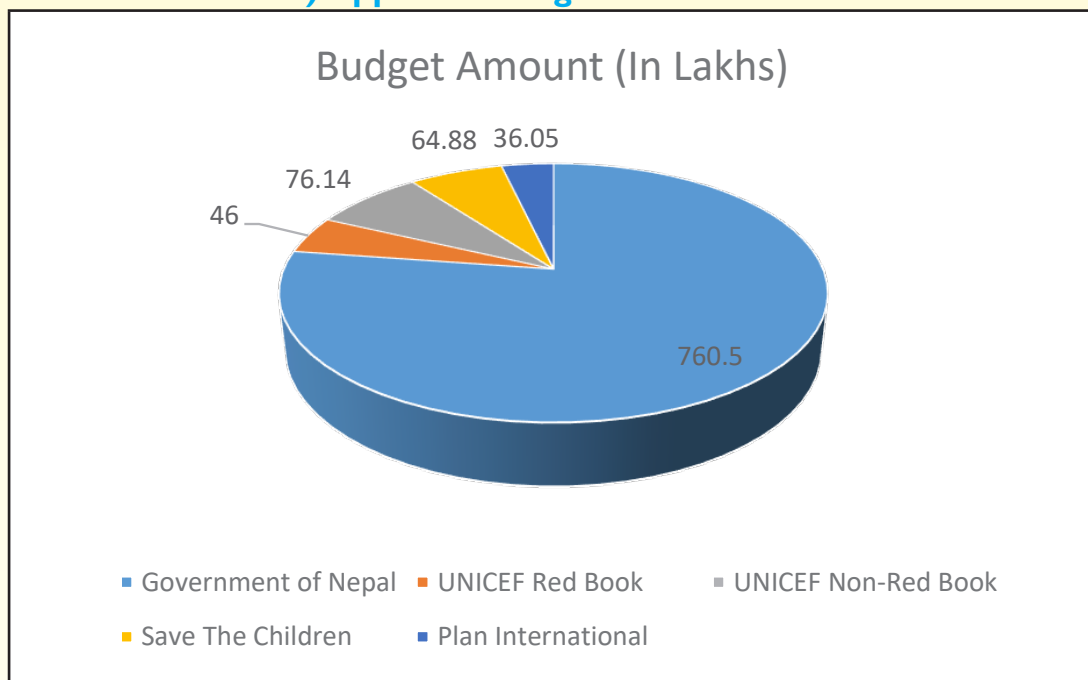

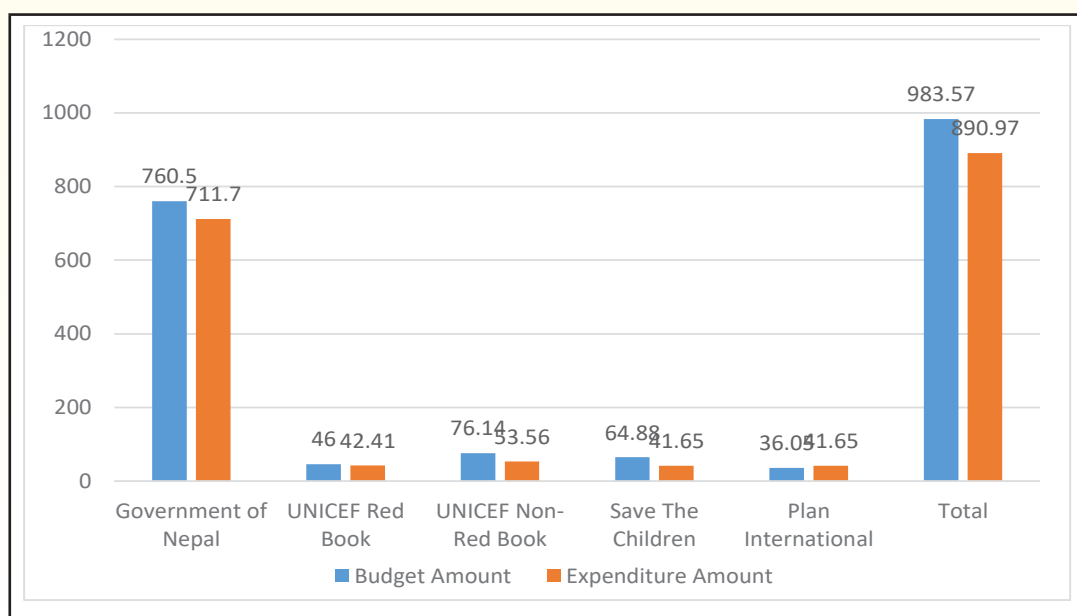
